At the beginning of the month, our foot patrols provided a valuable opportunity for community engagement and intelligence gathering. These interactions with residents contributed positively to our understanding of local concerns and strengthened our connections within the community.



Mobile patrols are a crucial part of law enforcement operations. They lead to actions such as vehicle seizures for lacking insurance and issuing tickets for driving that is not compliant with insurance regulations, and a section 59 warning for nuisance driving. Additionally, we conduct car searches if we have reasonable suspicion that the driver possesses something illegal.

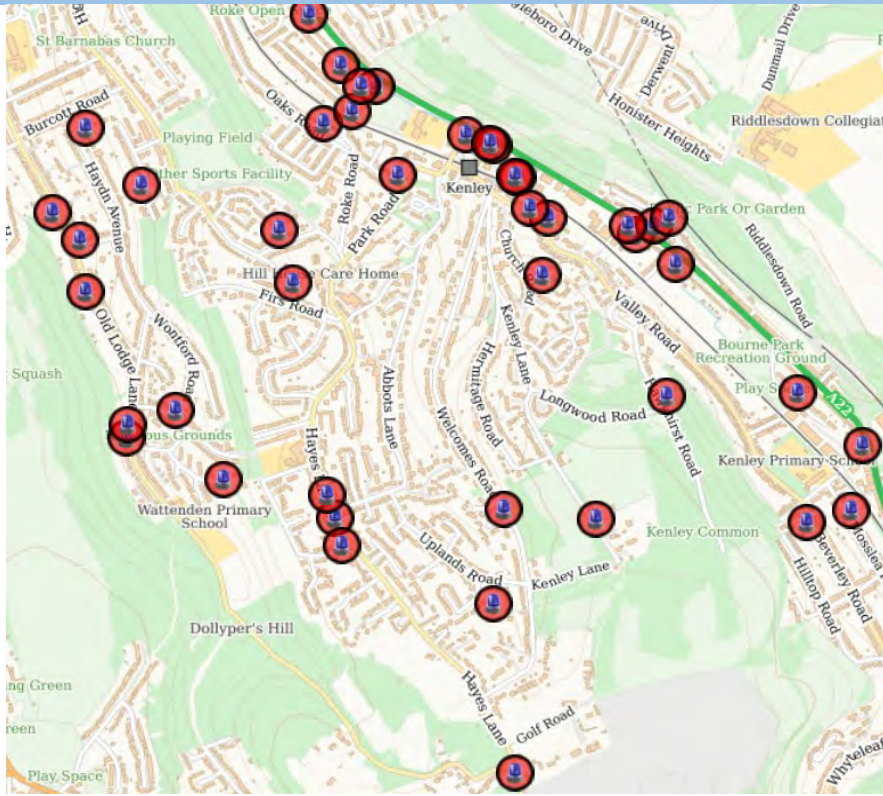

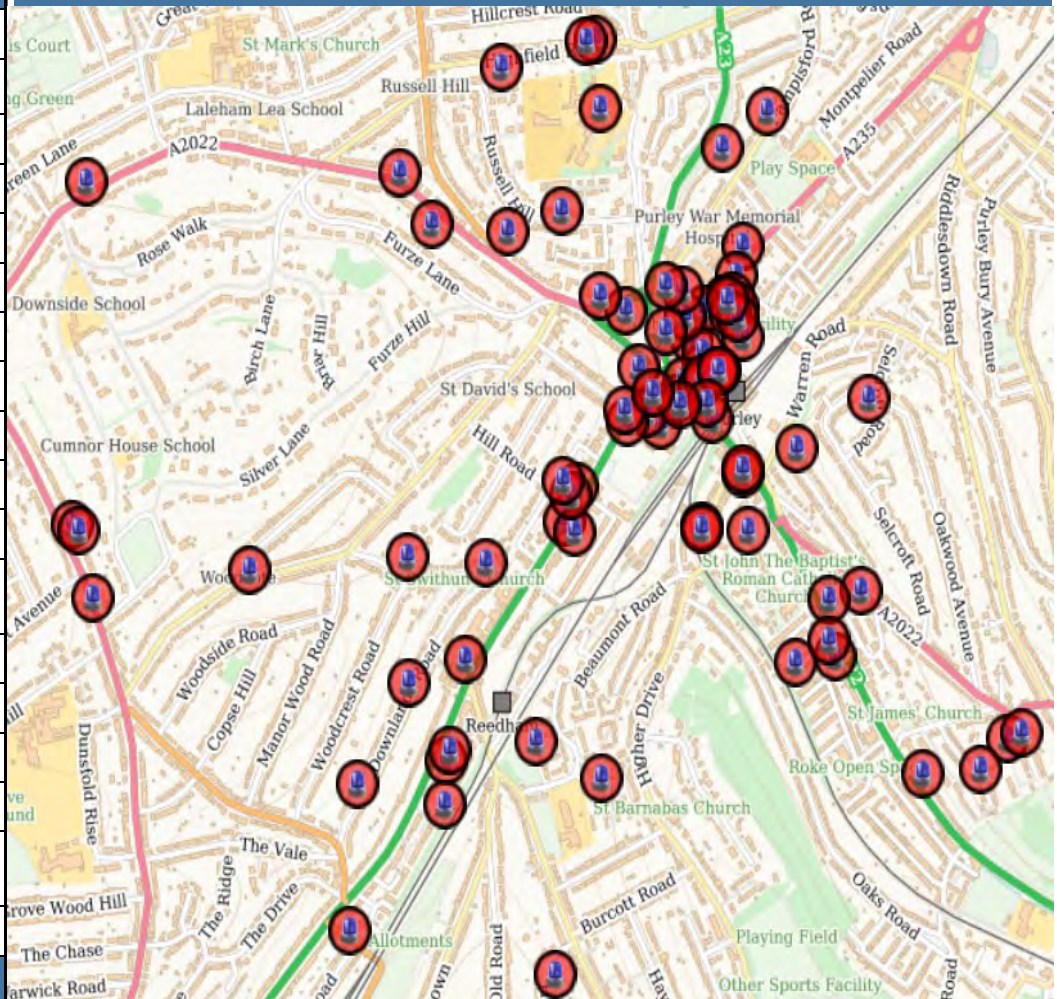

Domestic Abuse

What is domestic abuse?

Domestic abuse can include threats, violence, and coercive or controlling behaviour between people who have a relationship with each other (or have had in the past).

It can happen to anyone regardless of gender, sexuality, culture or religion.

It's based on one person having power or control over another, and it can worsen over time.

This can include but isn't limited to the following types of abuse:

- violent
- psychological
- financial
- emotional
- sexual

Domestic abuse also includes honour-based abuse and forced marriage. The Crown Prosecution Service website has a breakdown of the types of domestic abuse. Just one incident counts as abuse.

How to report domestic abuse

If you are suffering from domestic abuse, you're not to blame for what's happening. You're not alone.

Our first priority is to protect you and any children you have. If the situation is an emergency an officer will attend and, if appropriate to do so, arrest the perpetrator, and take action to protect you from further harm – giving you time to think.

You can report it to us or, if you're not ready to speak to the police, you can contact support organisations who will help you.

If you have a hearing or speech impairment, use our textphone service 18000 or text us on 999 if you've pre-registered with the emergency SMS service.

Other ways to report:

- online www.met.police.uk/report-domestic-abuse
- by calling 101 (If you have a hearing or speech impairment, use our textphone service on 18001 101)
- in the safety of your local police station (if you require a translator, we can provide someone initially by phone and later in person)

In an emergency, dial 999, or dial 101 in non-emergency.

Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme (DVDS) Clare's Law

'Clare's Law' gives members of the public a right to ask police if they are concerned that their partner or former partner may pose a risk to them. You can also ask about the partner of someone you know. Members of the public can make a request under Clare's Law at police stations or at www.met.police.uk
