Here is Coulsdon Wards update for the month of February. In line with ward priorities, the Coulsdon wards have worked collaboratively with other wards to conduct arrest enquiries and execution of a warrant on a cannabis factory in Purley. We have also worked with other teams on hi-visibility school patrols both on foot and mobile. We continue to do our best to work with Policing Partners, Outside Agencies and Residents for intelligence-led policing, to build **More Trust, Less Crime and High standards**. Below are the ward focus priorities reports



PRIORITIES

Violence against the person : We had a slight decrease of violence against the person reporting in the month of February on both wards (**Seven Common Assault and two GBH**) majority of these assaults are committed in private premises and some currently under investigation. We will continue to increase our hi-visibility patrols and reassurance visits where possible.

Burglary: We had five residential burglary offences reported to Safer Neighbourhood Team in the Month of February, We will continue to distribute leaflets and carry out reassurance visits where possible.

Robbery: We had no report of robbery in Coulsdon Town. However, two robberies in Old Coulsdon were reported - one personal and one attempted in the month of February. We will continue to conduct reassurance patrols in targeted areas.

KNOW HOW THE FRAUDSTERS WORK...

A FRAUDSTER'S CALL TO YOU Spot it and stop it!

A criminal contacts you, pretending to be a police officer or bank official. They claim there is an issue with your bank account, or request your assistance with an investigation.

They ask you to withdraw cash or foreign currency, provide your bank cards or PIN numbers, purchase high value items such as gold bullion, or hand over jewellery which will later be collected by a courier from your home.



POLICE OR BANK OFFICIALS WILL NEVER ASK FOR PIN NUMBERS, BANK CARDS, GOODS OR MONEY!

To make sure the caller is from the bank or really a police officer, hang up the phone at the start of the call and wait 5 minutes (criminals stay on your phone line) or use a different phone and call:

101 - to verify if the person is a police officer.

159 - to speak to your bank
(or call the number on back of card).

PROTECT YOURSELF FROM COURIER FRAUD

In most cases, courier frauds are when a criminal calls you claiming to be from your bank, the police or another trusted company.

Follow our tips to protect yourself:

- Be wary of unsolicited calls requesting personal or financial information
- Never provide money, bank details or make purchases after unexpected calls
- Speak to friends or family before taking action
